Grace Bible Church in Helendale was the venue for a Medicare Annual Enrollment Kick-off event on December 4. The day featured a doctor panel, informational booths and exhibits from health plan representatives and Social Security. Refreshments, goodie bags, and prizes were given out.

Attendees took advantage of the free health screenings, including bone density tests, cholesterol and glucose checks, and other screenings.

Representatives from Aetna, Scan, Health Net, Secure Horizons and Inter Valley Health Plan were on hand to answer questions about Medicare programs available to seniors.

Another event was held at the Barstow Senior Center on December 9, featuring a doctor talk on COPD and Emphysema, a doctor panel, booths and exhibits from health plan representatives and Social Security Representatives.
